2018 PETER PAN FLEET COOP REPORT:

1.0 Introduction:

The 2018 Peter Pan Fleet Co-Op was allocated 9,842 mt of the Inshore component of the BSAI 2018 pollock TAC. The individual catcher vessels belonging to the PP Fleet CoOp were given individual percentages of the Co-Op's allocation based on historical catch (confirmed by NMFS) brought to the PP Fleet CoOp. See Table 1-A.

Using information on historical catch history percentages, Table 1-B shows the pollock allocations by vessel for the entire year.

3.0 CO-OP CATCHER VESSEL SIDEBOARD LIMITATIONS, BSAI.

Peter Pan Fleet Co-op for the year 2018 fishing season was made up of 8 catch histories

Of the PP Fleet co-ops 8 catch histories, there are 5 vessels participating in the harvest of these allocations.

Of the 5 vessels 2 were Non-Exempt vessels fishing in both the mothership and the shoreside sectors.

Of the 5 vessels 3 vessels were under 99 GOA Exempt vessels.

It is to the understanding of the PP Fleet Coop that the vessels fishing both mothership and shoreside sectors are monitored by the mothership sector.
